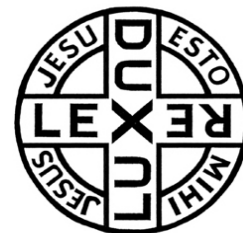

DO YOU NEED A 'JOPPA'?

Greetings everyone.

As I write this I am attending a reunion in Auckland of students celebrating their training at Bible College of New Zealand 50 years ago. The seventy plus ex-students attending are all over the age of 70. My! What a lot has happened as we listen to each others stories. Some have been martyred on the mission field, some have died and their spouses are here, one has built up a multi-million-dollar business and lost the lot through a crooked church elder/lawyer. Another has become a bishop and an MP. A few have seen their spouses go off with another man or woman. I have sat in the audience and laughed with those who tell funny stories of student and later life. Together we have rejoiced to hear how God has blessed lives. I, and others, have wept as some have stood at the microphone to tell of the deep waters they have passed through.

Jesus once asked his disciples (Matthew 16:15): "Who do you say I am?" Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the son of the living God." Then Jesus added something strange. Just as Peter had affirmed that Jesus was the son (descendent) of the living God, Jesus told Peter that he was the son (descendent) of Jonah (Jonas). Now – you will remember that Jonah went to the seaside town of Joppa from which he caught a boat, then a great fish before God got through to him to return and do what God had told him to do. Why did Jesus refer to Peter as 'son of Jonah'. I am indebted to my wife Alexis for passing on what she recently read in a John Hagee book: In Acts 10:9 we read that Peter was in the town of Joppa when he went up on the rooftop to pray for God's guidance in an important matter (Jews only / or Gentiles too?).

THE OSL INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE.

The theme was chosen well before the Conference and it was:

"God's promise of healing to a fragmented world."

Eighteen months before I attended I was asked, as a speaker, to supply a summary of what I was going to speak on for an hour. How about that! It was on the subject "Jesus – the Servant King." The Conference was held in a beautiful country mansion facility that had been gifted for Christian conventions. It was a delight to begin each day in the Chapel celebrating the Lord's Supper together. A musical team had been arranged and it was joined by two talented viola/violin players – one from the USA and the other from Holland. The UK OSL had arranged selected speakers who gave us a veritable feast over the five days. Chapters will have opportunity to purchase through the Gen Sec a complete set of the speakers – and on DVD. So you will both hear and see them. I will mention two, each for a particular reason. Rev Dr Jack Sheffield is an Episcopal priest who was absolutely dynamic! He runs a healing clinic in San Antonio Texas with a staff of 30 people. Dr Robert Frost spoke of his travels into China supplying Bibles to the underground church. He had his own TV channel (which I happened to come across accidentally whilst in the USA). I mention him because I have heard that he has died suddenly.

At the Conference, many felt a worldwide bonding being strengthened and it was decided to meet more frequently. So, International conferences are now 3 years apart, the next being in Canada 2010 and then NZ in 2013.

I was in hospital prior to surgery. The woman in the bed opposite me was depressed, especially at night time. While she slept she was very noisy, it seemed like maniacal laughter and other guttural noises.

After my surgery I was unable to eat, hooked up to machines and all I could do was just lie there in my bed and at night I kept hearing these noises. I silently prayed for peace for her in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ. After that the next few nights were quiet and peaceful until she was discharged. Prior to being discharged she walked over to me and smiled at me. I often wonder if my praying for her had any connection as she had never acknowledged me before.

My sister's husband died 15 months ago after she had nursed him for 9 years. Now at the age of 72 she was looking forward to having time to do all the things she had wanted to do over those years.

A short while ago I had a message to say that she had terminal cancer with secondaries in the liver. This is fatal and death is very quick. I was very angry with God. Why should she suffer like this and die without doing all the things she had been looking forward to? As she was in hospital in South Australia we kept in touch by phone. I did visit her once and we had a very good time being together.

One evening after eight weeks I rang and spoke to the nurse as at this time she was not talking on the phone any more. The nurse said that she was sleeping most of the time but roused when they did anything for her. I
