Dear Friends,

As I write this I am very conscious of the fact that it is less than 4 months to our OSL National Conference at Totara Springs, Matamata. Registration forms are in the process of being distributed. This is going to be a very good conference. The theme of the Conference is 'Jesus' Healing Ministry in Action'. We have excellent speakers and some great workshops. We are fortunate that Archbishop David Moxon has agreed to give the opening address. Our keynote speaker, the Rev Murray Talbot, is the senior pastor of one of the largest Presbyterian Churches in New Zealand and is a very good Bible teacher. Dr Annette Rice, a Medical Practitioner from Melbourne, will be coming to us as the Australian National Chaplain. She will speak on Tuesday evening and also lead a workshop 'Jesus' Healing Ministry in General Practice.'

We are also taking the opportunity to celebrate fifty years of OSL in New Zealand. There will be a chance to look back to remember the early leaders of OSL in New Zealand and give thanks to God for all that he has done over the years. It will also be a chance to look forward and discern what God is saying to us as we go into the future.

This is a conference not to be missed and I urge you to seriously consider coming and joining with members from all over New Zealand. The cost of \$360 may seem a lot but it does include all meals as well as accommodation. ## National Council and Conference 17-20 October 2011

Planning for conference has been taking place by telephone and email because of the members of the planning committee being scattered over various parts of the country, from Christchurch to Waipu Cove. Normally this has been done by a committee made up of the local area officers and members of the local chapters but as there is no local chapter at Matamata the load has been spread more widely.

Registration forms have been distributed to all chapters and postal members. If for any reason you have not received yours then contact your chapter secretary or for postal members your area convenor. It is also available from the events page of the website (near the bottom) if you require extra forms. Former and non-members are welcome to attend. It is our 50 year celebration of OSL in New Zealand. Let us make it a good one!!



We strongly encourage you to begin making plans to come to the conference. Each Chapter is entitled to have two voting members present but only one representative will have their travel costs subsidised by OSL over and above the first \$100 which may be paid by the Chapter. (The 2 representatives can of course share the subsidy between themselves but only 1 may make the claim). Other chapter members may attend the conference as non-voting members. You are encouraged to book early and seek the most cost-effective travel arrangements to minimise the cost to the OSL and yourselves. Remember that the Rugby World Cup will be in progress so air travel in particular will be much in demand. Registrations must be in by 1 September. If flying remember either Hamilton or Tauranga will have shuttle buses arranged to get you to Matamata. **If possible allow to arrive at the airports before 10.30 to be in time for the main shuttle bus departure.**

- Chapters start raising money to assist your members to attend
- Book early to get the best fares.

## News from the Southern Area:

The Taieri Chapter meets at St Luke's on the Taieri which is situated in Mosgiel. Mosgiel is the main town on the Taieri Plains. The Plains are bordered by some lovely hills including Saddle Hill (yes, it does look like a saddle and was named by Captain Cook as he sailed along the Otago Coast), the Maungatuas, Flagstaff and the Silverpeaks. If you have flown into Dunedin you fly over Silverpeaks and I know, when I have flown in, that is the place where you will experience turbulence. The other border is Lake Waihola. I am biased, I know, but I think it is a beautiful area and love living here on the Taieri – close enough to Dunedin to go into town occasionally but far enough away to have a country feel about it. In fact, Mosgiel's motto is 'City Living, Country Style'.

As we meet at St Luke's it is sometimes assumed that the Order of St Luke is a St Luke's gathering so over the years we have tried to educate local folk that it is for everyone.

In the last year we have had to look at the ministry and have had a time of change. We were holding a healing service monthly with a band, teaching and healing ministry available. Due to a number of circumstances this service had to be discontinued. I had been appointed as the OSL convenor/secretary for our chapter and with others prayed about what we should do. Should we continue or should we let the Taieri Chapter fade away into the sunset – those were the two choices.

After praying the word that came from God very clearly to us was "persevere". That led to the questions – how, when, what, where – we knew the why!! So after very frank and open discussion we decided to meet monthly (as usual) for a meeting which included a shared lunch, teaching and prayer. Our vision is to go out to other churches and to our local communities and in time, have a Healing Centre. One of our members thought that we did not spend enough time in prayer so now we have the chapel at St Lukes open once a month for a time dedicated to praying for OSL matters. If people can't make it to the chapel they are encouraged to spend that time praying wherever they are. So, while we seem to have taken a backward step, there is a great deal of positivity and energy around the Taieri chapter.

We hope to bring a testimony from another of our members in the next issue so stay tuned for that.

On June 29<sup>th</sup> my daughter, Ann, underwent surgery for a brain tumour. A scan, two days earlier, showed it to be at the right front of her brain. It was growing fast, and needed to be removed ASAP.

Ann went home on Monday July 4<sup>th</sup> and is making steady progress. She has since visited her GP twice and is to have radiotherapy and chemotherapy for the next few months, but she is very positive, and I believe her faith has been strengthened.

God used two very ordinary people to bring about Naaman's healing. If ever you feel inadequate in any way remember that God can use you in your weakness to bring his plans to fruition.
