Last time I wrote of an **Unexpected Healing**. The young  
lady continues to board with us and is a very helpful and  
pleasant person. She enjoys living with us, alcoholism is a  
distant memory, she accompanies us to church and is very

**"Try tears"**. The story is told of General Booth, the founder of the  
Salvation Army. A young evangelist wrote to Booth why he didn't seem  
to be successful in winning souls to the Lord. The General wrote back:  
"Try tears." Of course, behind the suggestion was the Godly  
requirement of exercising a deep, genuine, heartfelt sense of  
compassion for the lost. The 'lost soul' senses it and God uses it  
because God reads our heart and motives.

Once when pastoring a Baptist church I received a young policeman  
visitor into my office. He sat opposite my desk and explained that he  
decided to call upon me because in his childhood he had gone to a  
Baptist Sunday School – and felt he needed to talk to a Baptist  
minister. A few days earlier he had attended the funeral of his young  
wife. She had a night-shift job in a town north of Wellington. Two weeks  
previous she had walked in the dark to cross the double railway line  
leading to her parked car. There was a misty light rain and she paused  
at the lines to observe a goods train coming. When it had passed she  
began to cross. The noise of the goods train disguised an electric unit  
coming the other way. As he spoke, I thought of my wife who was in  
the same area teaching each day and always travelled to school and  
back by the electric unit. My mind dwelt upon a scenario where my wife  
might do what his wife did – for my wife occasionally had late nights,  
and crossed the railway lines to Porirua Station. He recounted the last  
time he had seen her and fondly farewelled her to her work. When he

Early in July 2006 I was diagnosed with bowel cancer and by the end of that month was in Whangarei Base Hospital to have an operation. On the morning of the operation I woke with the verse of the well known hymn going through my mind “Praise my soul the King of heaven, to his feet thy tribute bring; ransomed, healed, restored, forgiven, who like me his praise should sing?...” To me this was confirmation that God had heard my prayer for his presence and protection for this operation and that with his help and the skills of the medical profession I would be healed and restored. Also I had the added assurance from the medical staff that they would take extra care of me while I was under the anaesthetic as during a previous operation in 2004 I had experienced a stroke while under anaesthetic having a double hip replacement.

Everything went well with the bowel cancer operation and I was told after a week or so that they had caught the cancer in the early stages and there was no need for follow up therapy such as radiation or chemotherapy so after eight months all is well and I am able to live a normal life. So Praise the Lord and thanks to all who supported me with prayers and with practical assistance.

Kevin and his wife Sheryll, are running a Healing Seminar over Queen's Birthday Weekend, called "The Divine Plumline". Again it's for all the local church community, but already some OSL members have indicated their intention to attend. Kevin says the Seminar looks at things like: Rejection & Rebellion; Depression & Grief; Personal & Family Dysfunction; A Wounded Spirit; Repentance & Renewal; The loving authority of God, Healing, Wholeness & Holiness. The Seminar is based on Amos 7: 7-8 and was designed by Dr Bruce Thompson, a NZ General Practitioner and Counsellor. (Kevin & Sheryll led a workshop on this topic, at the last International Conference of OSL in Melbourne.)
