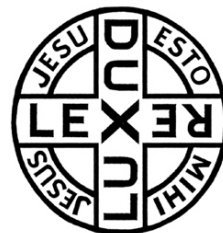

Greetings everyone from Warden Brian, and thank you for your prayers after a cardiac concern I had recently. I guess my topic this time could be **AN UNEXPECTED HEALING.**

We have a spare room in our home. Recently a Christian nurse approached us asking if we would give board to a client of the doctor she works for. Knowing the Christian doctor, we agreed. The woman was described as 'a recovering alcoholic'. She settled in. We soon discovered she was far from 'recovering' and had a raft of other problems. However, once our new occupant had settled in we sought to be ready to minister to her needs – despite wondering how we came to have the challenge. One evening when she was out visiting her family or friends she experienced physical violence and ended up in hospital. We have not yet discovered what actually happened. We visited her in hospital and found her unable to walk and heavily sedated. In a very uncertain state she arrived back home. Did she release herself? We don't know. What we did know was that she was far from well. A few days after her return she came to me with a small crucifix – asking me to 'bless it'. Her background is Catholic and this Protestant pastor had never been asked to bless a crucifix. Well - I took it away, held it in my hands, and prayed that the owner would experience healing. I placed it in an envelope with a Christian inspirational card and left it where she would come across it. Within a short time of her finding it a transformation began. She now not only walks easily, but is active physically and mentally alive. She has not touched alcohol for two weeks and says the thought of it repels her. And a variety of previous health problems have gone. Her mother is unable to explain the dramatic change.

News of the death of the **Rev Dr Rufus Josephus Womble** will have saddened many members. He died in Richmond, USA, on 16 Nov 2006, aged 94. He was the North America Warden for OSL 1978-1984, Rector in Little Rock Arkansas for 22yrs before continuing his ministry in OSL, teaching a class in his church in Richmond to within the week he died. He was active until the end! His doctorate was Doctor of Divinity.

Rev Pat Bawden writes: Rufus Womble was very much present at the 50th Anniversary Celebrations at Washington in 1997...I asked him about the chorus with the words..."*Oh I love Jesus, I love Jesus, I love Jesus with my soul*"



"*we but touch the hem of His garment,
and His touch has made me whole*"

I could only remember the last line so when I asked him, Rufus Womble had us all sing the chorus at an early morning communion. He was certainly very much alive then and very much enjoying the 50th Anniversary of OSL, of which he had been a part for a very

long time.

Rev Brian & Shirley Flower write:

Members will remember Rufus well from his unforgettable visit to NZ in 1983 when he was the speaker at the Stoke Methodist Church, Nelson where the Warden's Council was held that year.

His speciality was RISO therapy - treatment by laughing - and after telling several amusing stories, announced that we were now in a really healing atmosphere. We have vivid memories of Bishop Peter Sutton sitting in the back pew of All Saints Church, Nelson where the healing service was held, listening to his "haw, haw, haw" laughing at Rufus's stories. Rufus wore a beautiful blue cassock from which he let Shirley snip a little piece from the seam so that we could match the colour for our OSL Chaplain stoles. In his address he said that we should not accept the concept of "sometimes God says 'Yes'; sometimes 'No'; and sometimes 'Wait awhile'." Jesus in his love and compassion, did not say to the man with the withered hand, "You're not ready for healing; wait a while." He said, "Stretch forth your hand." Rufus gave a testimony to his complete healing from rheumatoid arthritis in spite of his doctors telling him he would never be free of pain. When thanking the doctor for his care, he replied that Rufus should be thanking God not the doctor as his healing was outside medical care. **Rufus said thanksgiving, penitence and faith open the way to wholeness. People can be ill and not be healed until someone loves them. We should be channels of God's love.** About 350 were present at the service. Rufus Womble was a colourful, loving and effective ambassador for the Healing Ministry.

We have his book "Wilt Thou Be Made Whole?" with a personal inscription, which we bought at the Warden's Council in Stoke, 24 September 1983.

Our latest Miracle Experience

A young man, 15 years old, was playing rugby in a curtain-raiser in Auckland. This occurred last season. He was kicked in the temple and had lain in a coma for some weeks. One of our Chapter brought this report to the Tuesday meeting. Immediately we prayed for Matangi Te Waka, who was still lying in a coma in Starship Hospital. Today, 2 weeks later, 7 November 2006, we learned he came out of the coma at 2pm on Tuesday two weeks ago. *Praise the Lord for answered prayer!*

One of our members had a vision while we were praying, of Jesus lifting Matangi up in His arms. And, corroboration of the time too! Matangi's brother, Chris, had to leave the Hospital at 1.45pm on that Tuesday of the miracle, and, as he started the drive home (4 hours away) he thought "I expect when I get home I will hear Matangi had come out of the coma." ... That is precisely what happened. The phone call, the wonderful news and yes, it had happened just after Chris left the Hospital.
