Missioner's Visit to the United States

(A brief report from Derek Lightbourne)

Chapters of the Order of St Luke in North America are each expected to hold a Healing Mission annually. It was in responding to invitations from two Chapters that led me flying to the United States, via Sydney in September. The Sandhills Chapter is in Pinehurst, North Carolina, known now as the Golf Course where Michael Campbell won the US Open. Chapters in the US are generally associated with a particular church, and in Pinehurst it is the Emmanuel Episcopal Church. Two days after arriving, I led a Healing Mission focusing on 'Living with Stress,' a Biblical and Christian approach. We explored ways that the Sabbath rest can be observed in a busy world, and how the story of Martha and Mary has such relevance for Christians in ministry, and in relationship with Jesus. This was followed on Sunday with preaching and to speak at their Adult Forum which takes place after the main morning Service. During the week following there were a number of different ministry opportunities, as well as time to enjoy the early autumn days (with temperatures ranging between 22 and 28!)

Then it was on to the Piedmont Chapter in Winston Salem, also in North Carolina, a city known for its treasuring of Moravian customs, brought here by families escaping persecution in Europe in the 1700's. The Healing Mission at St Paul's Episcopal Church was attended by over 80, and was on 'Healing in the Family.' Again there were wonderful opportunities to share on Jesus' healing to very big congregations. (Not often does one preach to 485 people in a Service!). Also, an Adult Forum was held, and in the afternoon a Healing Service of Celebration and Hope.

A feature of the ministry visit this time was the opportunity to speak about Jesus' healing in places outside the church setting (during the week). This included two health professionals working with Cancer patients; others with children and families with disabilities; hospital Chaplains and also a group of divinity students studying for ordination. There was very real openness to a Christian approach, and general acknowledgment of the very real part of spirituality and healing in those among whom these folk were working.

The visit was rounded off by a few days holiday in New York, and opportunity to experience the vibrancy of this City, as well as its much sadness and joys. Please accept my sincere thanks to you all for your prayers and support in this time of ministry.

Notices of events will need to be sent to us by the secretary of the chapter. They will be converted here into a standard format (as per the notices already on the site). You do not need to be an internet user to advertise your event and we hope that non-members will in time discover the site.

We are starting to get forms on the website so that when one is needed it is an easy matter to print it off and not to be using out-of-date ones. The last "Heal-Link" issued and "10 Reasons" are both shown there with instructions for printing. Two commands are shown in each case – "view" and "print", the latter having the pages in the order of printing, not in sequence for reading, for which you will need to click "view". If you have any problems at all with the website please let us know and we will try to guide you through them.

Greetings from Warden Brian:-

HEALING THE HOMOSEXUAL

This is quite a topic to write about in this issue of HEAL-LINK:

But it's in the news isn't it? Yes – the Presbyterian Church of New Zealand has voted at its Assembly by 65% to 35% to acknowledge marriage between a man and a woman as the only relationship between two people. This rule is to govern candidates for the Church ministry and Church leadership. I will not go into a discussion on this here – for the emphasis of "Heal-Link" is healing oriented. However, I would like to tell you about a very special period in my life where "homosexuality" and "healing" met each other.

One evening a man slipped into the back seat of my church. From here on my life was impacted forever. The man was a converted homosexual. Not just that – but he had been the leader of the 'gay' movement in Auckland, had gone to the Soviet Union, and trained as a counter spy. On his way back by a devious route he met an Anglican vicar who led him to the Lord. You may recall David Lange sending a Russian diplomat home! My friend initiated this – and the whole story would take more space than I have here.

My friend established a ministry in Wellington for homosexual men who wished to be healed. It grew to over 50 men and there was a 90% success rate – for in the process they found God. I was the Chaplain to that group for a few years. I shall never forget our first Communion Service courtesy of a Presbyterian Church. Can you imagine sharing the Lord's Supper with a congregation who testified to the healing power of our Lord Jesus Christ in the particular area they had struggled with? In another city a similar group had arisen among lesbian ladies who desired release. The two groups supported each other and the inevitable 'happened' between the two leaders. It was my special privilege to officiate at the marriage of the two leaders in Old St Paul's, Wellington. Yes, in all the talk about 'homosexuality' this is one area we don't hear much about.

For those who desire it, Jesus Christ heals and changes.

CALLED TO HIGHER SERVICE

Bess Burrough, wife of the late Amos, former Warden from 1981-1983, has died in Feilding, aged 86.

Bess had suffered much pain for a great deal of her latter years (25 years at least which is the extent of our knowing Bess and Amos). There was never a complaint, always a smile and a welcome, giving God the glory. We had stayed with them both in Linton Court and at Kimberley Grove where for some years they hosted the 6 monthly Executive Meetings in their lounge. They were stalwarts of the Order. They had been members for some years of the Palmerston North Chapter and later established a chapter at Ashhurst where in retirement Amos was ministering to the church there, before moving to Feilding.

I attended the funeral of **Bess Borough**. It seems such a short time ago that I was there for Amos. In 1964 my first teaching appointment found me at Arapohue School - in Amos's Methodist area. The first time I met this sincere and godly man was when he came to school for 'Bible in Schools'. Many of my pupils and their parents were Methodists and I went to one of their home groups. What role models Amos and Bess were for me as I went on to marry a teacher there. They leave a wonderful family that exhibits the fruit of Christ-like example and love.
